Forest and Outdoor Learning Awards (FOLA) FAQs

<u>The Award</u>

Q: Who is the awarding body?

A: Newbattle Abbey College, near Edinburgh, is supporting this qualification as part of their <u>Forest College</u> and the awards are accredited to the Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF).

Q: Is this still a Forest School award?

A: Yes, the award you receive at the end will still be recognised as a Forest School award, although it will be called a Forest and Outdoor Learning Award.

Q: Will this Scottish qualification be recognised by employers?

A: We have worked closely with Forest School Association to ensure this award is recognised by them as a <u>valid Forest School award</u>. The FSA is the industry professional body for quality and standardisation in the UK so there is no reason why any employer wouldn't.

Q: What are these qualification levels equivalent to within the UK & Ireland?

A: This SQA document compares them: <u>Qualifications Can Cross Boundaries</u> (pdf)

Q: How do these new qualifications relate to the OCN or other FSA-recognised Forest School qualifications?

A: Level 1 (introduction) = FOLA Level 5; Level 2 (assistant) = FOLA Level 6; Level 3 (leader) = FOLA Level 8.

Q: What is the difference between Forest School award and FOLA?

A: As well as being tailored more in line with the Scottish curriculum, the leadership modules are slightly more in-depth, plus it has an additional section on legal compliance.

The Course

Q: How many days of the taught course is required in total to complete Level 5, 6 or 8 in the FOLA course?

A: Level 5 (introduction) = total 3-days; Level 6 (assistant) = total 5-days; Level 8 (leader) = total 10-days. There will be additional self-study or assessments required to reach each level, whether that be written coursework, observations or delivery of sessions.

Q: How long does it take to finish the Level 8 qualification?

A: That depends upon you and your individual circumstances. Most people are able to complete their coursework and deliver their 8 Forest School sessions with their group of learners within about 12-months of the end of their taught course. Some people have completed it within 6-months, whereas others take longer.
